Rajnath in Moscow for SCO meet, no meet with Chinese minister

New Delhi, Sept 2: Defence minister Rajnath Singh left for Russia in a special IAF plane from Delhi early today to attend a crucial meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO), which is taking place under the shadow of an escalating border row between India and China, two of the bloc's key members. Besides attending the SCO defence ministers' meeting on September 4, Singh will hold talks with Russian defence minister Sergey Shoigu and several other top military officials with an aim to expedite implementation of a number of procurement programmes, officials said. Singh will depart from Moscow on the evening of September 5, they said. Chinese Defence Minister Gen Wei Fenghe is

Big push for ties with Russia

Defence minister Rajnath Singh in a tweet message has said that during this visit, I shall be attending the combined meeting of Defence Ministers of Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO), Collective Security Treaty Organisation (CSTO) & CIS members in commemoration of the 75th Anniversary of victory in the World War II. I shall also be meeting Russia's Defence Minister, General Shoigu to discuss bilateral cooperation and issues of mutual interest. India and Russia are privileged Strategic Partners. Looking forward to further this partnership during my visit.

also expected to attend the SCO meeting. The defence minister's visit comes just days after India withdrew from a multilateral war game to be held in Russia, and expected to be attended by the Chinese and Pakistani troops. Asked about the possibility of a bilateral meeting between Singh and Chinese defence minister Wei on the sidelines of the SCO event, officials said there is no such plan.

The SCO defence ministers' meeting is taking place in the wake of fresh tension between India and China following Chinese army's unsuccessful attempts to change the status quo on the southern bank of Pangong lake in eastern Ladakh. The two sides have held several rounds of diplomatic and military talks to end the border standoff which began on May 5. The fresh attempts by China to change the sta-

Buses back on roads, Commuters hail covid prevention measures

Chennai, Sept 2: After more than five months, operation of buses resumed here to a lukewarm response from passengers and places of worship, parks, shopping malls, hotels and clubs too reopened on Tuesday across Tamil Nadu. After sanitisation, buses were brought out of depots while drivers and conductors started work after a temperature check. In several places, workers offered prayers and broke pumpkins, a customary practice to ward off the evil eye before hitting the roads. Transport Minister M R Vijayabhaskar said only a very less number of people used the services on the opening day across the state and assured more buses after looking into the people's response in the days to come. Out of the fleet strength of about 22,000 buses in state-run transport corporations, 6,090 were operated today within the confines of each district and services are open upto 9 pm, he told reporters. COVID prevention protocol of allowing a maximum of 32 and 24 passengers in mofussil and



city buses respectively were followed, he said. Wearing of masks is mandatory and sanitisers are placed in buses for sanitisation of hands, he said. To a question on the buzz in social media about a "hike" in bus fare, he ruled out such a possibility. The monthly travel passes issued before the lockdown will be valid upto September 15, he said. A Metropolitan Transport Corporation official said of the fleet strength of over 3,000 buses



resumed operations in a limited manner in Tamil Nadu except Chennai, Chengelpet, Kancheepuram and Tiruvallur. In the state capital and three nearby districts, buses that were operated on March 24 have restarted services only now. The government, for transportation purposes, had divided the state into eight zones (comprising a number of nearby districts), and allowed public transport buses within the zones doing away with the need for e-pass for intra-zone journeys. However, the inter-district or intra-zone public transport services were later withdrawn as COVID cases increased.

Modi to address virtual UN General Assembly on Sept. 26

United Nations, Sept 2: Prime Minister Narendra Modi is expected to address the UN General Assembly on September 26, according to a provisional list of speakers issued by the world body for the high-level meeting. For the first time in the UN's 75-year history, the annual General Assembly session this year will be held virtually and heads of state and government will not be physically attending the annual gathering due to the coronavirus pandemic. World leaders will submit pre-recorded



video statements for the session. The Department for General Assembly and Conference Management at the UN on Tuesday issued the provisional list of speakers for the General Debate of the 75th session of the General Assembly to permanent missions. According to the list, Modi is expected to address the General Debate on the morning of September 26. However, it must be noted that the list is provisional and two more iterations will take place as schedules and speakers for the General Debate can change in the course of the next few weeks. The final speaking order for the General Debate could be different. The General Debate will commence on September 22 and run through September 29. Brazilian President Jair Bolsonaro is listed as the first speaker. The US is traditionally the second

Final year semester exams after Sept. 15: Minister

Chennai, Sept 2: The Tamil Nadu government is making arrangements for college students to write final year exams in person after September 15, higher education minister K P Anbalagan said on Tuesday. Nearly 4 lakh students are yet to take their fi-

nal year exams in arts, science and other professional courses, including engineering, due to the Covid-19 outbreak. In a release, the Minister said the details such as time table and exam centres would be released shortly. Students would have to take the physical pen and paper exams, he has said. Meanwhile, the Tamil Nadu Engineering Admissions has planned to open the website for architecture programme aspirants. Applications for B. Arch programme may be downloaded from www.tneonline.org/website from September 7.

No question hour in parliament's monsoon session due to COVID-19

New Delhi, Sept 2: Due to the coronavirus pandemic, there will be no question hour and private members' business during the monsoon session, according to a notification issued by the Rajya Sabha Secretariat. Parliament is scheduled to begin from September 14 and conclude on October 1. Those who attend the session would be required to follow the necessary coronavirus protocols, including getting tested for Covid-19 within 72 hours. Top Government sources confirmed to ANI that the monsoon session of Parliament is to be held on a daily basis with no break even on the weekends. Proceedings of both houses will be held on a daily basis. On day one (September 14), Lok Sabha will be held from 9 am to 1 pm while Rajya Sabha proceedings will be held from 3 pm to 7 pm. After September 14, Rajya Sabha will sit in the first half from 9 am to 1 pm and Lok Sabha's processing is scheduled from 3 pm to 7 pm. Both the houses of the Parliament is to sit for four hours daily and every precautionary measure would be taken by the government in view of the pandemic. Lok Sabha Speaker and Rajya Sabha Chairman already held a meeting with officials and gave instructions in the presence of the Health Ministry officials regarding how Covid-19 guidelines should be followed in this monsoon session.

TN assembly session to be held from Sept. 14 in Kalaivanar Arangam

Chennai, Sept 2: The Tamil Nadu Assembly will convene for its next session on September 14 at a more spacious government auditorium here instead of its chambers in the historic Fort St George, in a virtually unprecedented development forced by the COVID-19 pandemic. Tamil Nadu Governor Banwarilal Purohit on Tuesday summoned the assembly to meet on September 14

at 10 am in the multi-purpose hall on the third floor of the Kalaivanar Arangam, in the heart of the city, a Raj Bhavan communique said. The business advisory committee will meet and decide on the number of days for the session later. The auditorium offers ample space to ensure social distancing norms for the legislators besides sprawling parking facility. Assembly Speaker P Dhanapal had on August 22 inspected the Kalaivanar Arangam premises following a request to identify a safe venue to hold the session due to the threat posed by COVID-19. The previous Budget session was wound up on March 24, ahead of the scheduled closure on April 9, a day before the nationwide lockdown to prevent the spread of coronavirus came into force.

India's COVID-19 tally crosses 37 lakh, death toll 66,333; recoveries above 29 lakh

New Delhi, Sept 2: India's COVID-19 tally of cases galloped past 37 lakh on Wednesday with 78,357 new instances of the disease reported in a day, while the number of recoveries crossed 29 lakh pushing the recovery rate to 76.98 per cent, the Union health ministry data showed. The death toll climbed to 66,333 with 1,045 more fatalities reported

in 24 hours. India has so far reported 37,69,523 cases of the viral disease, according to the data updated at 8 am. The total number of COVID-19 recoveries in the country has surged to 29,01,908, while the fatality rate has further declined to 1.76 per cent. There are 8,01,282, active cases in the country which comprises 21.26 per cent of the total caseload, the data stated. India's COVID-19 tally had crossed the 20-lakh mark on August 7 and went past 30 lakh on August 23. According to the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), a total of 4,43,37,201 samples have been tested up to September 1, of which 10,12,367 were tested on Tuesday.

Sumit wins first round in US Open, a rare feat in seven years

New York, Sep 2: Sumit Nagal became the first Indian tennis player to win a round at a Grand Slam in seven years when he downed American Bradley Klahn in his US Open first round, setting up a contest against world number three Dominic Thiem, here. Returning to the Flushing Meadows where he took a set off Roger Federer last year, the Indian got past the local rival, ranked just a rung above the Indian at 126th in the world, 6-1 6-3 3-6 6-1 in two hours and 12 minutes on Tuesday night. Somdev Devvarman was the last Indian to win a main draw match at a major and incidentally, it was at the US Open in 2013 when he beat Slovakia's Lukas Lacko after coming through qualifiers.
